

# Reading Your Water Meter

Being able to read your own water meter is a very good way to track your water consumption and better help to conserve water, not only saving our most precious resource, but saving you money.

The meter itself is very easy to read. The meter can be interpreted from right to left. The far right number on the dial is a fixed number, always zero. The second from the right moves one number for each revolution of the pointer. As each wheel rotates from one (1) through zero (0) it causes the wheel to its immediate left to advance one number.

Only the numbers in the white boxes are used in keeping tabs as to how much water has been consumed. They represent thousands of gallons. You are always billed in units of thousands of gallons of water, never in fractions thereof. The reading on the meter should **ALWAYS** be the same or greater than the current reading on your latest water bill.

The meter **CANNOT** move if there is no water flowing through it. The red triangle shaped piece is the indicator that water is moving through the meter.

If the meter were to err, it is **ALWAYS** in the favor of the customer, due to wear of the mechanical parts of the meter.

Numerical values from **right to left**:

1st dial.....Always Zero

2nd dial.....Tens of Gallons

3rd dial.....Hundreds of Gallons

4th dial.....Thousands of Gallons

5th dial.....Tens of Thousands of Gallons

6th dial.....Hundreds of Thousands of Gallons

7th dial.....Millions of Gallons
