NAPA, California – On May 26, 2018 at 4:01 PM, Napa Central Dispatch received a 9-1-1 call of an armed robbery that just occurred on Hagen Road, near Silverado Trail. The victims provided a description of the suspects who fled in a Hyundai. A Napa County Sheriff Deputy located the fleeing vehicle in the area of Hagen Road and First Avenue. A vehicle pursuit ensued. The vehicle fled toward the Napa Expo where BottleRock was being held. Once in the area of BottleRock, two suspects exited the vehicle and fled on foot. One entered the fairgrounds via a Third Street gate while being pursued by law enforcement. He was immediately arrested. The other suspect was not located but he was last seen outside of the venue.

In an effort to ensure public safety, the entrance gates to BottleRock were secured when the suspects attempted to enter the venue. Concert attendees experienced a delay until the area was deemed safe.



During the investigation, detectives discovered the victim met the suspect during a private party sale of jewelry. The victims were not physically harmed.

We would like to thank all of the BottleRock Staff, CHP, Napa Sheriff's Office and citizens for the help and patience. We are working to identify the second suspect. He was described as a light skinned Hispanic male with dark curly hair, in his late 20s to early 30s, wearing a black t-shirt and jeans.
