

## VOTE BY MAIL - All Napa County voters

---



Napa County is participating in the Voter's Choice Act. The Act was adopted in 2016 by the California Legislature to allow counties to conduct elections under a new model that provides greater flexibility and convenience for voters.

Voters will vote by mail this election. Ballots will be mailed to registered voters beginning October 8, 2018, 29 days before Election Day November 6, 2018.

Voters can return their ballot 1 of 3 ways:

- **By Mail**
- **In an Official Ballot Drop Box**
- **At a Vote Center**

## DROP BOXES

---

Drop Boxes will be placed and available to drop your ballot off at any time of day, any day of the week beginning October 9, 2018, 28 days before Election Day November 6, 2018.

## VOTE CENTERS

---

A Vote Center is a mini elections office. Vote Centers will be open beginning Saturday, October 27, 2018, ten days before Election Day. On Election Day from 7am to 8pm.

At a Vote Center, you can:

- Cast a ballot
- Use an accessible voting machine
- Request a replacement ballot
- Register/Re-register to vote
- Drop off a completed ballot
- Receive assistance in another language
