**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
CITY OF NAPA
TO ADOPT AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING DISTRICT-BASED ELECTIONS FOR
COUNCILMEMBERS BY AMENDING NAPA MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 1 TO ADD A NEW
CHAPTER 1.10 (“DISTRICT-BASED ELECTIONS”), AND APPROVING THE DISTRICT
BOUNDARY MAP AND SEQUENCE OF ELECTIONS FOR COUNCILMEMBERS**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on May 5, 2020 at or after 6:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, City Hall, 955 School Street, Napa, California, a public hearing will be conducted by the City Council of the City of Napa at which time all persons are invited to provide public comment and input on the proposed adoption of an ordinance establishing a district-based election system, which includes the district boundary map and sequence of elections for Councilmembers.

Due to the unprecedented impacts of the Coronavirus, the hearing will be televised live, the City will receive public input for this hearing in writing, and the Council Chambers will be closed to the public. On February 11, 2020, the City Council adopted a resolution declaring the City of Napa’s intent to transition from at-large elections to district-based elections for Councilmembers, outlined specific steps to facilitate the transition, and estimated a timeframe for the transition.

On February 25, 2020 and March 4, 2020, the City Council held its first and second Public Hearings before drawing a draft map, to receive input on the composition of district boundaries for a district-based election system for Councilmembers.

Due to the need to manage limited and constrained resources in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, and to be consistent with guidance provided by Public Health officials, previously scheduled map hearings on March 17, 2020 and April 7, 2020, were cancelled.

On April 21, 2020, the City Council held its third Public Hearing to consider draft district boundary maps and the proposed sequence of elections, receive input from the public and the Council, and introduce an ordinance establishing a district-based election system, including approval of a district boundary map and sequence of elections for Councilmembers. The public hearing on April 21, 2020 included a presentation of draft district boundary maps and proposed sequence of elections and provide the opportunity to receive and consider further input from the public. Draft district boundary maps were posted at least seven days in advance of the public hearing, on the City's website at <https://www.cityofnapa.org/902/MAPS>.

On April 28, 2020, the City Council will hold its fourth Public Hearing to consider draft district boundary maps and the proposed sequence of elections, receive input from the public and the Council, and introduce an ordinance establishing a district-based election system, including approval of a district boundary map and sequence of elections for Councilmembers. The public hearing on April 28, 2020 will include a presentation of draft district boundary maps and proposed sequence of elections and provide the opportunity to receive and consider further input from the public. Draft district boundary maps will be posted at least seven days in advance of the public hearing, on the City's website at <https://www.cityofnapa.org/902/MAPS>.

On May 5, 2020, the City Council will hold its fifth Public Hearing to adopt an ordinance establishing a district-based election system, including approval of a district boundary map and sequence of elections for Councilmembers. Draft district boundary maps will be posted at least seven days in advance of the public hearing, on the City's website at <https://www.cityofnapa.org/902/MAPS>.
